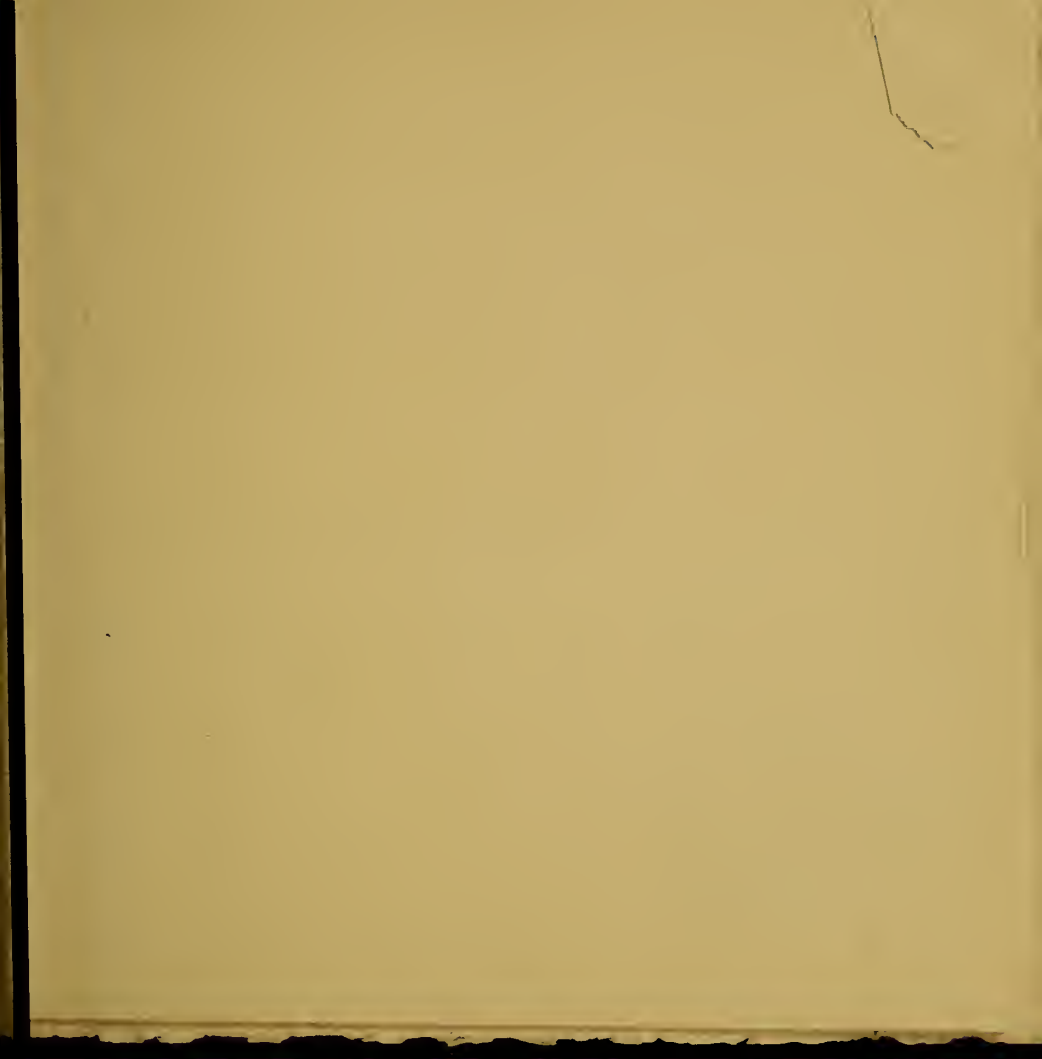


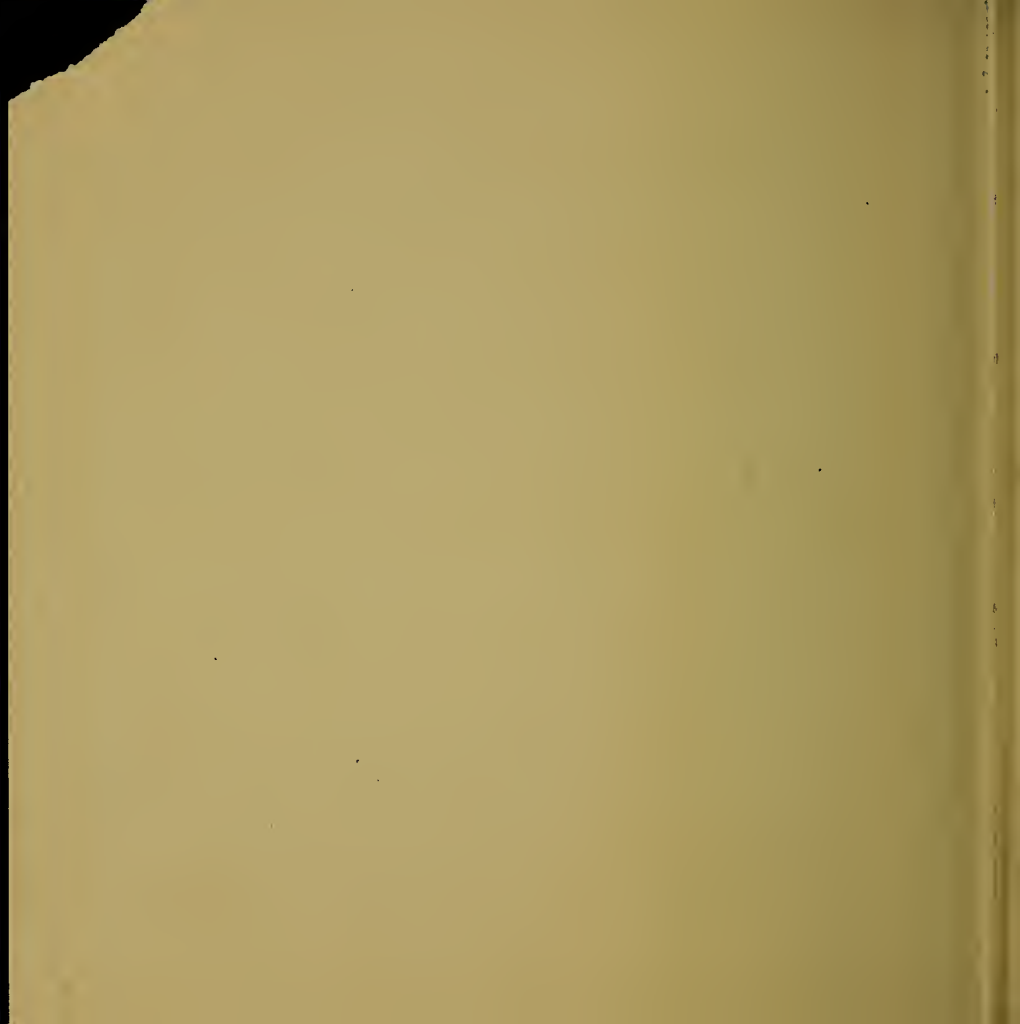

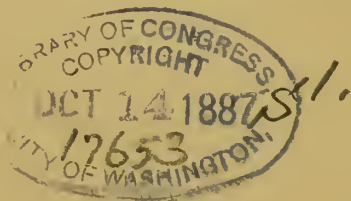

To court in gay attire,

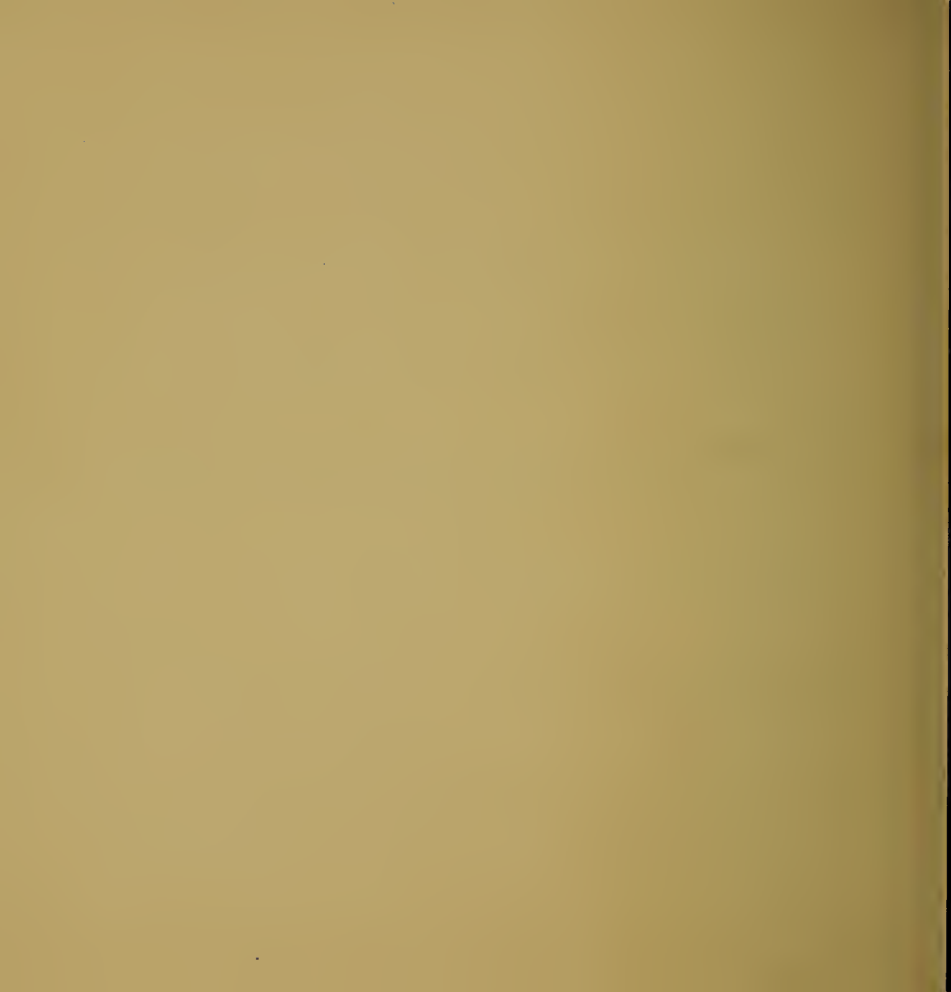
This Christmas day I go;
