
Pages 13 to 17 show various designs of Desk Lecterns, ranging from simple and inexpensive forms to more elaborate styles.


On page 18 are shown new designs for a combination of Lectern and Prayer-desk, an article of furniture which can be utilized for reading the Prayers from as well as the Lessons.



ALTAR FURNITURE.
























DESIGNS FOR ALTAR VASES IN SPUN AND CAST METAL. J. & R. LAMB, 59 Carmine St., N. Y.



DESIGNS FOR ALTAR VASES ENGRAVED AND CHASED. J. & R. LAMB, 59 Carmine St., N. Y.



BAPTISTRIES.


The construction and erection of the Font in the Baptistry of the Church, or in the situation which may be selected for it, necessarily admits of the greatest variety of taste, and the few examples which our limited space permits us to give can only be regarded as suggestions. The size, style and material of the Font itself, of the Font Ewer, the Standard Rail, etc., should all be considered with regard to the architecture of the Church, the amount of space at disposal, and the nature of the light. The fuller the information furnished us the greater will be our means of determining these vital points, and a sketch or a cut can be promptly forwarded that will meet the wants of the case. Whenever it is possible to dignify the rite of baptism by having a Baptistry designed for such services it is very much wiser so to do, and we shall take pleasure in making any suggestions and submitting plans designed to secure this result wherever the original plan of the church building did not include the idea of a Baptistry.

DESIGNS FOR FONT COVERS AND FONT BUCKETS. J. & R. LAME, 59 Carmine St., N. Y.








The above cut shows the Ambler Memorial Tablet, which now hangs in the Corcoran Gallery at Washington, preparatory to being permanently placed in one of the governmental buildings there. This is a large bronze Tablet, modeled by Mr. Joseph Lauber, Sculptor, from a special design arranged by us at the suggestion of the committee. It commemorates the death of James Markham Ambler, the Surgeon in charge of the Jeannette Exploring Expedition, who was lost on the Lena Delta in the fall of 1881. The memorial was erected by his comrades, the Surgeons of the Navy, as a token of their esteem for him and regret at his untimely death. The correctness of the scene has been assured by the personal criticism of Engineer Melville, one of the survivors.




Above is shown the modeled Tablet of oxidized silver erected in the room of the Eighth Company, Seventh Regiment, New York, in memory of Henry C. Shumway and George William Smith, late Captains of the Company. The Tablet was made to fit into the panel above the mantelpiece, which had previously remained undecorated. The design for this was modeled by Mr. George T. Brewster (pupil of Mércie, Paris). The panel receives in the centre the figure of a Roman soldier with shield and sword. The Regimental motto appears behind the figure, and a palm branch deftly combines the several parts of the composition.


LOW RELIEF CENTRAL MEDALLION .- Jos. LAUBER, SCULPTOR, N.Y.
















MONUMENTS.

Special designs will be submitted upon request, as well as photographs of work already executed.


